Dear Parents,

I want to give you an update on what we have been working on this summer regarding our return for the 2020-21 school year. In response to COVID-19, I formed a committee of healthcare providers, parents, and staff to develop a practical guide for daily operations based on the risk of COVID-19 or any contagious infections. We decided that a leveled approach is the best way to prepare for all scenarios. We believe each level will provide adequate health measures while also maintaining a normal atmosphere for students.

Each level focuses on PREVENTION as the most important way to avoid an outbreak. We are pleased to permanently add several protocols to our daily routines as well as many upgrades to sanitation measures throughout campus. As the risk of infections increases, we elevate sanitation and distancing efforts.

Our plan also takes our students' academic and social experiences into consideration. School should always be a safe, fun, and loving environment. We do not want to enforce daunting restrictions like extended use of face masks but we will do whatever is in the best interest of our students. Our solution was to create two levels that segregate students in the event of an outbreak. Their homeroom or grade level would essentially become their "family." They would learn, eat and play with their "family" to reduce interactions with other students and restrict the use of common areas. There is no need for distancing or face masks within your "family" unless an outbreak occurs.

We hope that Level 5 and 6 are precautionary only. We will use every available square foot of our campus to ensure that we can remain open unless otherwise mandated. We know that being on campus provides the best experience for our students, but their health and safety is top priority. All students will receive a Chromebook and will use Google Classroom starting the first day of school. I am confident that if we reach Level 5 or 6, our students and teachers will be ready for a seamless transition.

I would like to thank Karie LaFleur, MD, Tiffany Hayes PA-C, Ashley Green and Patricia Upton for all the time and energy they have given to help OLPS School open back up on August 7th! This committee will meet regularly throughout the summer to address other policies and procedures. I encourage you to reach out to me if you have any questions or concerns that you would like us to discuss. We are open to anything so please do not hesitate.

Please review the following Infection Prevention Plan. You can access this information at any time on our website. I am confident that TOGETHER we will have a successful school year. COVID-19 may have brought us new challenges, but we are ready! Here's to the best school year yet!

Hand sanitizer stations will be added outside of every classroom, bathroom and common area. Portable stations (courtesy of Hayes Manufacturing) will be located at all entrances and high traffic areas.



Touch-free thermometers were purchased for carpool and office temperature checks.




Portable carts for teachers to change classes in Levels 2-5 were purchased.



We have increased our budget for sanitation supplies. We are working with a local sanitation manufacturer to purchase cleaners that locals hospitals are using.



Floor stickers will be applied to remind students to wash and sanitize their hands. Health class in the 1st 9 weeks will include more emphasis on the importance of good hygiene techniques.



We are making a designated area for sick children waiting to be picked up.
